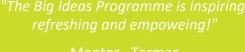

We were delighted to once again be able to host our Regional Finals at seven universities across England. The Big Ideas Competition 2023 National Final took place at the Palace of Westminster on 5th July and it was a day to remember! We were joined by 50 students from 12 schools, plus representatives from our brilliant Business Partners, judges, teachers and MPs to listen to our National Finalists take to the stage one last time and present their amazing Big Ideas.

2023 WINNERS AND THEIR BIG IDEAS



First Place went to SoftSleeps from Oaks Park High School. SoftSleeps' Big Idea was a service that created sleeping bags out of recycled plastic waste to support the homeless. They were entered into the National Final as a Wild Card Entry!



In second place was Hydrobus from Plashet School. Hydrobus' Big Idea was a bus using hydroelectricity generated from mini power plants operated by the team and local communities.



Third place went to Red Ribbon from Gladesmore Community School. Red Ribbon's Big Idea was an organisation raising awareness on gender and LGBTQ+ issues, facilitating support groups and manufacturing organic and affordable period products.
